The Slavic Workshop creates an atmosphere favorable for the efficient mastery of a Slavic language. It enables students to complete a full year of college language instruction during a single eight-week summer session, free from the burden of other academic commitments. The Workshop does not intend to replace or imitate study in the Soviet Union or other Eastern European countries; rather it complements foreign study programs by using all the facilities of Indiana's large, diversified university environment to provide high quality

language instruction at home. The Workshop also augments Indiana's own substantial resources in the Russian and East European field by providing a faculty selected both from the Indiana University Department of Slavic Languages and Literatures and from among the best language instructors in the U.S. and Canada.

TO THOSE WISHING TO SUBMIT MANUSCRIPTS

Manuscripts for consideration should be submitted in **four**, double-spaced copies. Footnotes should be double-spaced and placed at the end of the manuscript. Manuscripts are sent to referees anonymously and should be prepared accordingly. Library of Congress transliteration should be used. In general, articles should not exceed twenty-five pages. Manuscripts will not be returned unless postage is provided.

The policy of the *Slavic Review* is not to consider materials that have been published or that are being considered for publication elsewhere.

Publication of articles in the *Slavic Review* is ordinarily limited to those submitted by members of the AAASS. Nonmembers wishing to submit manuscripts are asked to request a membership application.
