## TO THOSE WISHING TO SUBMIT MANUSCRIPTS

Manuscripts for consideration should be submitted in four double-spaced typed copies. Footnotes should be double-spaced and placed at the end of the manuscript. Manuscripts are sent to referees anonymously and should be prepared accordingly. Library of Congress transliteration and the *Chicago Manual of Style* are to be followed. In general, articles should not exceed twenty-five pages  $8\frac{1}{2} \times 11$  in dimension. Manuscripts will not be returned unless postage is included.

The policy of the Slavic Review is not to consider materials that have been published or that are being considered for publication elsewhere.

Publication of articles in the Slavic Review is ordinarily limited to those submitted by members of the AAASS. Nonmembers wishing to submit manuscripts are asked to request a membership application.
