

PSA PRIZES FOR YOUNG SCHOLARS

The *Philosophy of Science Association* is happy to announce two new prize competitions. The first of these is for an essay written by a graduate student; the second is for an essay by someone who has received a Ph.D. within the last five years. Essays may be on any topic in the philosophy of science, and should be submitted to the Editor-in-Chief of *Philosophy of Science* before September 1 1996. The essays entered will be judged by a committee of three senior members of the PSA, and the results of the competitions will be announced at the Biennial Meeting of the Association in November.

Winners in each category will receive \$250, and the winning essays will be published in *Philosophy of Science*. A person who is eligible to enter may submit for consideration an essay already accepted for publication in *Philosophy of Science* within the period September 1 1995 to September 1 1996. When the winning essays are published, they will be accompanied by an announcement to the effect that they were judged the best in this year's competition.

It is anticipated that these competitions will be continued in subsequent years (we hope indefinitely). The financial support for the prizes has been made possible by the generosity of past presidents of the PSA.
